The Next Great Awakening...

Later this month I will once again be travelling to Black Mountain in North Carolina for the Board Meeting of Presbyterian Reformed Ministries International (PRMI). I am grateful to the local churches supporting me in this wider work of ministry, which is helping advance the Kingdom of God in various parts of the world.

I have been involved with the Dunamis Project since it came to the UK in 2000, and GEAR has partnered with PRMI over the last two decades as sister organisations. The focus is very much on equipping, deploying and sending Spirit-filled witnesses to Jesus Christ – seeing disciples growing and using their gifts in his service.

The ministry moved its base to Brad Long's home area when he became Executive Director in 1990, and they acquired the land to create the Community of the Cross in 2003. This is located on 24 acres of hilly land ten minutes' drive from the town, and it provides the administrative and spiritual support base for PRMI's involvement in the worldwide advancement of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The log house provided an initial meeting place, but an extra building was soon added to offer more office and meeting space. After a large fire in 2018, the rear of the log house has now been remodelled and extended to provide a larger meeting room and two more bedrooms.

In the summer, meals are enjoyed in the large, screened porch in front of the house, overlooking the river which flows along the edge of the land - a beautiful relaxing vibe between business sessions!

The new Prayer House was dedicated in January during the Dunamis Fellowship



International gathering which followed the Board meeting. After a few hiccups, they have recently been able to begin ministry there. The plan is now to build more accommodation on site. as resources allow. as most participants in programmes currently have to stay elsewhere in the locality.



The Board is made up of 12 men and women, mostly American or Canadian - including one Chinese lady and a black church leader. The president is based in Nicaragua. We meet in person twice a year and have other interim meetings, sub-committees and prayer gatherings on Zoom. When I joined, the first two meetings were hybrid ones and I dropped in from home – burning the midnight oil when they had evening sessions, five hours behind our time zone.

A significant focus of PRMI is now around preparing for the next Great Awakening, having discerned that the Lord is on the move in various parts of the world, and we all need to be ready and prepared to receive and disciple those who come to faith. These are exciting times in the global church. It is so good to be connecting with the bigger picture and seeing the work of the church in places like South Korea, South America, Indonesia, and among the Chinese community In New York – much of which is truly inspiring.

A Testimony

Nahum 1:7 "The Lord is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble; He knows those who take refuge in Him"

During the Sunday service at the beginning of July, when we sang "I will sing of the goodness of God" a personal testimony immediately came to mind. It was a time, in 'a day of trouble', when I realised that I was absolutely convinced that the Lord Is Good! I felt a fluttering in my stomach as of the Holy Spirit encouraging me to share so I prayed for an opportunity, but it didn't come during that service. I was relieved when I realised that my opportunity would come in 2 days' time at Bible Bite. Roy and I would be leading, with Brian teaching on Psalm 51. It was the perfect opportunity. In order to be open, transparent and broken before the Lord as David was in Psalm 51; in order to receive His Forgiveness, we do need to know that God is good - and true to His Word. Adam and Eve seem not to have been convinced of these things, because Satan was able to challenge their concept of God in the garden of Eden with "did God really say..."? And since then, everyone in the human race defaults to doubt His goodness until we are set free from sin and our minds are reprogrammed to be assured that He has our best interests at heart – and that He is true to His Word.

In Zimbabwe during our courtship, Roy & I broke up a number of times. Roy was worried about his children feeling abandoned by their Dad if he were to remarry (they were living with their Mum) and each time I realised that he was not able to make a commitment, I would break up. But then he would start our relationship again and so it went round and round. Finally, our pastor challenged Roy that he <u>must</u> make up his mind – he couldn't keep me in limbo forever. Roy realised he was definitely too unsure to make the commitment to marry me, so this time he was the one who ended our relationship. And that's when I really knew I had to lay it down completely. Well, I cried for a whole day and Roy waited with me where I was living with Mum (who was away at the time) and Carol. Carol was at work and Roy left as soon as she got back. I told Carol what had happened and she asked me if I was angry with God. Isn't it strange how a question can bring crystal clear clarity! In an instant

I absolutely <u>knew</u> that – despite the tears – God would bring me through it victoriously because <u>God Is Good</u> – I had no doubts.

I had an encounter with the Lord sometime prior to this. Being in my mid-forties and single all my life, I had always hoped that one day I would marry. I struggled with feeling left on the shelf – and 'deprived'. One day the Lord clearly showed me that He loves me so much that I would be fulfilled whichever path He led me on – even if it were singleness. He also gave me the opportunity of staying with a godly couple whom God had clearly brought together, yet they were clearly struggling with issues – so I had been reminded that the joys of marriage come hand in hand with (sometimes enormous) challenges that single people do not face. Consequently, for the first time ever as far as marriage or singleness was concerned, I was genuinely able to say "Lord, I am willing to embrace whatever You have for me". The revelation of His love was so special. Roy's breaking off our relationship when we were so close to being married was the test of my belief about God's goodness!

My recollection from one of the daily readings in "My Utmost for His Highest" by Oswald Chambers always stays with me: "Unless we can look the deepest darkest fact full in the face without discrediting God's character, we don't know Him"

As you can see, in His own timing (only some months after that) God saw to it that we did marry!

Psalm 51 ends with verses 18 & 19, which read in the Passion Translation:

"Because You favour Zion, <u>do what is good for her. Be the</u> <u>protecting wall around Jerusalem</u>. And when we are fully restored, You will rejoice and take delight in every offering of our lives as we bring our sacrifices of righteousness before You in love!"

These verses can easily be glossed over because they seem to represent a change of subject. However, I was really excited about the insight the Lord gave me concerning a further aspect of His Goodness. He gives us the ability to intercede effectively <u>because</u> <u>of</u> our own brokenness, pain and sin! Because of his brokenness, pain and sin, David was in the place of being able to fully identify

with and intercede effectively for Jerusalem – "... do what is good for her. Be the protecting wall around Jerusalem..." How <u>good</u> is that! May our own experiences lead us also to intercede effectively!

May we sing (as Jerusalem will also be able to sing one day): "And all my life You have been faithful, And all my life You have been so, so good, With every breath that I am able Oh, I will sing of the goodness of God ... I love Your voice You have led me through the fire In the darkest night You are close like no other..."

Swift Nesting Boxes in our Tower?

At a recent Church Meeting we shared about the possibility of installing nesting boxes behind some of the slats in our bell chamber. My cousin Robin is the Conservation officer for BCP Council just across the water and he spends much of his spare time pursuing the same interests. He came over



with a friend from Hampshire Swifts to check the feasibility of this, and also met Bill Croydon at Aspire to look at their tower. Both places seem very suitable sites for a pilot project, and they hope to be able to install five boxes in each location in time for next season – by April. Our own Robin and Sue have had two boxes fitted to their house and there is activity!!

Swifts really are birds of the air. They eat, sleep, drink and mate on the wing, landing only for brief periods when breeding, in nooks and crannies in buildings or rock-crevices during the period May to August. Young birds, on leaving the nest site, do not breed until they are three years old, so they have no need to land, anywhere, in that time.

Swifts migrate here from Southern Africa to northern latitudes in the spring – a journey typically of around 6,000 miles. They arrive with us in early May, find their previous mate and if they locate their old nest site, breed quickly. The young fly the nest site in August then both adults and young depart our shores in late-August, flying back to Southern Africa.

Swifts are unobtrusive, often silent and fantastic housekeepers. Quite often nest sites in houses go unnoticed by occupants, as the birds go about their business rapidly and quietly. Even when feeding young they may only visit to feed three or four times a day. The family will roost together at night in the nest space which the adults keep scrupulously clean. The only time anyone may be aware of Swifts in their area is during the summer, when they gather in small parties, wheeling around the sky, sometimes flying low down over roof-tops socialising and bonding with each other, with their highpitched calls.

Swifts used to be more numerous but, unfortunately, their population in the UK has dropped by 65% in the last 25-30 years. They continue to decline at an alarming rate. Swifts, like many other of our once common breeding birds, are now on the Red-list of Birds of Conservation Concern. The reason for this decline is simple – holes in buildings are being blocked when older, wooden fascias and soffits (eaves) are replaced by tight-fitting plastic. Birds are therefore excluded; birds which have used the same clean nest site for years and years no longer have a home. Not only that, new spaces are limited so the numbers successfully breeding go down.


Hampshire Swifts is passionate about Swifts. We are trying to change the fortunes of these beautiful and enigmatic birds by encouraging as many churches to install purpose-built nesting sites in suitable locations. Already we have fitted Swift-boxes to houses on the Isle of Wight this year and we are looking at working with the United Reformed Church to install specially designed and fitted boxes behind louvres high-up in the church tower. The church will be in good company. Winchester Cathedral has an array of Swift-boxes in the bell-tower and a good proportion are already occupied. Other churches where boxes have been fitted recently include St Mary Magdalene (New Milton), St Mary's Church (Twyford) and Christ Church (Winchester). Swifts are already nesting in one or two older buildings in Shanklin and there are reports of parties of birds wheeling around the town. Swifts are very good at finding holes in buildings; their very success depends on this so, once fitted, there is every chance that we shall see Swifts using the boxes in the tower. To help in the process we will be fitting a "call-player" which emits a sound that copies a Swift-call, and has proved successful elsewhere, attracting birds soon after being installed.

Good News... for a change

LOL = Laugh Out Loud

The Bible story which always makes me 'laugh out loud' is found in John Chapter 9. Do read it again, it's hilarious! And that was the story we presented at St Blasius school on 11th July. St Blasius has



asked for a team to regularly present Open the Book from September, so this was a one-off to give them a taster. We arrived at 08:00 to set out the props. As we were rehearsing, a support assistant brought in a little girl with special needs, and explained to her what we would be doing. That child plus 5 others were later dressed as disciples of Jesus and a crowd to take part in the story.

Before it started, the children seated in the hall were invited to join in various interactions. Every time Roy read "I have a question", the children repeated it and drew a question mark in the air. But the bit they liked best was pulling a face and saying "Yuk" when Jesus spat on the ground, made mud, then rubbed it on the blind man's eyes. "It was really messy" (Yuk) read Roy, as 'Jesus' wiped his hands down his tunic.





A helpful bystander drew water from the well for the blind man to wash. The week following this presentation at Haylands School in Ryde, I asked the children what happened after the blind man washed away the mud. The little boy who answered responded with the <u>exact</u> words from the script: "He was blind no more".





Back at St Blasius, the crowd gathered round the man (who could now see) and bombarded him with questions. A strict religious leader asked how Jesus could be on God's side. It was the Sabbath, so Jesus was breaking God's law. The children in the crowd were encouraged to put up their hand as each question was asked. The third child didn't need prompting – her hand shot up as soon as Roy read "I have a question." The poor man was overwhelmed and finally shouted out: "I don't know the answers to all your questions, but I do know this. Once I was blind and now I can see. Who but someone sent by God could do a thing like that?" Exhausted, he went and sat by the well. Jesus turned up and also had a question. He asked: "Do you believe God sent me?" The man was delighted to say he did. At which point Jesus said "Then, no more questions." And everyone shouted 'Hooray'.



Back in May some of us took a morning service at Sandown Methodist Chapel. Praise God, 2 ladies came up afterwards and said they were interested in joining an Open the Book team. They, and about 20 others, came to Newport Congregational Church on July 8th for an 'Air and Share'. The Bible Society had arranged for our Regional Development Officer, Steff Shepherd, to come from the mainland and lead that event. Rev Hugh from St Catherine's had brought along 2 of his congregation and said there were 2 more who were keen to take assembly at St Francis School, Ventnor. As a result, there will be a training day at Shanklin URC on Saturday 19th August after which we hope to set up 2 new teams. That will be another 300 children for whom the Bible will regularly be brought to life in a fun way they can understand and will remember. "To love and serve Persecuted Christians"

Prayer Alert: Urgent Request from Nigeria

A Release International partner in Nigeria has messaged us, asking for urgent prayer for his country and particularly vulnerable Christian communities that have recently come under attack.

'Please pray for our country Nigeria and [particularly] for



Plateau state and also some parts of Benue state where the Fulani herdsmen have recently been fighting the communities,' he said.

'Many are recorded dead and many more are displaced. In the Mangu area of Plateau state, a curfew has been imposed by the state government.'

He added that the federal Government had deployed the army in these communities to try to restore peace.

Updates

Thank God that the wife and son of the late Chinese Christian

lawyer **Dr Li Baiguang** have made it to safety in the US.

Dr Li, who defended the religious freedom and human rights of ordinary citizens, died at the age of 49 under suspicious circumstances in China in 2018.

His wife and son, Hanmei 'Hannah' Xu and Qingxin 'Pure Heart' Li, are presently seeking asylum, according to our partners, ChinaAid and Voice of the Martyrs Korea.

'Since Dr Li's sudden death in early 2018, his wife has been closely controlled and monitored without freedom of movement by agents arranged by the Communist Party of China in order to prevent her from having contact with anyone overseas,' said Bob Fu, head of ChinaAid.

ChinaAid also reports that several leaders of the **Golden Lampstand Church** in Linfen who have been falsely accused of fraud will go on trial on 21st August.

Chinese authorities used dynamite and heavy machinery to destroy the church's building in 2018.

This faithful house church has steadfastly refused to join the government-sanctioned church and as a result the congregation has faced intense persecution.

Pastor Wang Xiaoguang and his wife Pastor Yang Rongli (pictured right) have been detained for than more two years. They are said to be weak in their health but still pray for each other in prison and miss each other greatly.



Prayer & Praise

Pray for an end to the violence in northern and central Nigeria,

particularly Plateau and Benue states

Ask God to comfort all those bereaved, injured or displaced by the recent attacks and pray that the military will be effective in stopping further violence

Thank God that Dr Li's family have made it to safety in the US. Pray that they will be granted asylum

Praise God for the Golden Lampstand Church and the faith of leaders Wang Xiaoguang and Yang Rongli. Pray for recovery in their health and for justice to prevail at their trial in August

Pray for the acquittal and release of the many other detained believers in China.

Our brothers and sisters throughout the world are facing '**trials of various kinds**'. As we give thanks to God for the freedom we have to worship and our comfortable church building, do please remember those who are paying such a heavy price for following Jesus and may it spur us on in our discipleship to be those wholly committed to our dear Lord Jesus, who gave up the glory of Heaven and suffered the most cruel death, that we might be saved.

Blessings in Jesus' Name

In this month's article, Neil looks at our foundational need to grow in maturity as Christians ~ by seeking to know God better through scripture ~ only then are we able to live out our faith daily. Neil goes on to suggest 10 outpourings of our faith which would show such maturity ...

An Intact Belief System

"If you point these things out to the brothers and sisters, you will be a good minister of Christ Jesus, nourished on the truths of the faith and of the good teaching that you have followed." (1 Timothy 4:6)

One problem with Christian maturity is trying to base spiritual growth on practical sections of the Scriptures and spending too little time internalising the doctrinal sections. Each of Paul's letters tends to fall into two major parts. The first part is generally doctrinal, such as Romans 1-8, Ephesians 1-3, Colossians 1-2, etc. These sections reveal what we need to know about God, ourselves, sin and salvation. The second half of each letter is the practical section: Romans 12-15, Ephesians 4-6, Colossians 3-4, etc. These passages describe what we need to do to live out our faith in daily experience.

In our zeal to correct the problems in our lives - doubt, temptation, satanic attack, conflict in families, friendships and churches which are falling apart - we jump to the practical instructions of God's Word. We want a quick fix, a rule or instruction, which we can apply like a plaster to make things better.

Perhaps you have already discovered that a sticking plaster approach to daily living doesn't work. Why not? Because when you

don't understand the truth of your position in Christ, you have no ground for success in the practical arena.

How can you "Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer" (Romans 12:12) without the confidence of knowing "since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 5:1)?

When your basic belief system about God and yourself is shaky, your day-to-day behaviour system will be shaky. But when your belief system is intact and your relationship with God is based on truth, you'll have very little trouble working out the practical aspects of daily Christianity. Show me someone who knows who they are in Christ and who is filled with the Holy Spirit, as taught in the first half of the Epistles, and I will show you someone who will instinctively live according to the second half of the Epistles. It will be the "natural" thing to do.

Loving Father, I desire to know what I need to know about You so I can live the way You desire for me to live.

Do It Anyway

"Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." (Galatians 6:10)

Fresh crackdown on Christians in Iran with arrests of more than 50 converts

There is a fresh and aggressive crackdown on Christians in Iran, with more than 50 converts arrested in the past seven days – and the number could well rise.

Your urgent prayers are needed following the arrests of more than 50 Christian converts in a wave of incidents over the past seven days in Iran, and there are fears this could rise.

This fresh and aggressive crackdown on believers in their homes and house churches has occurred in five different Iranian cities: Tehran, Karaj, Rasht, Orumiyeh and Aligoudarz. At least 51 are believed to remain in detention, whilst others have been released on bail.

Morality police return to the streets – with greater aggression

It's unclear what accounts for this crackdown, but it coincides with the morality police being more visible and aggressive on the streets, having withdrawn to an extent following the protests that emerged in the wake of Mahsa Amini's death whilst in custody in September 2022.

"The reason for this sudden surge in nationwide arrests of Christians is not clear at this stage," says Mansour Borji, advocacy director for Article 18, which lobbies for Christian freedom in Iran. "What is obvious is that Iran has begun a fresh crackdown on civil liberties, and the traditionally vulnerable groups, like Christians, are on the front line of those targeted."

Highlighting the return of the morality police to Iran's streets, he added that 'overall there seems to be a renewed or more aggressive crackdown on groups the regime feels threatened by'.

The news comes after it emerged that Pastor Nadarkhani – whom many of you have been praying for – has had new charges levelled at him, just months after being released from prison.

House churches viewed as a threat

Iran is number eight on the World Watch List, with the latest report, released earlier this year, highlighting a slight increase in persecution against Christians. The country is ruled by an increasingly strict Islamic regime, which views the existence of Iranian house churches as an attempt by Western countries to undermine Islam and their authority. This is why many of the charges levelled against Christians centre around crimes 'against national security'.

Thank you for your continued support for Iranian sisters and brothers. Please continue to uphold them in prayer.

Please Pray

For an end to this crackdown and the sudden arrests, and that all those arrested will be freed without charge

- That those in prison will be guarded from harm and that they, and their families, will feel God's close presence with them
- That the authorities' hearts towards Christians will soften and that there will be greater religious freedom in Iran.

Further Information

- > Iran is number 8 in the Open Doors World Watch List 2023
- > Almost everyone in Iran is Muslim there are believed to be about 1.2 million Christians in a population of more than 86 million (1.4%).
- > Main threats are Islamic oppression & dictatorial paranoia.

How are Christians persecuted in Iran?

- Iran is ruled by an increasingly strict Islamic regime, which views the existence of Iranian house churches as an attempt by Western countries to undermine Islam and their authority. Christians who have converted from Islam face the greatest risk.
- Iranian Christians may be banned from education, lose their jobs and find it very difficult to get back into employment. For women, the situation is even more precarious because Iranian law grants women few rights. If discovered as a Christian, they are likely to be violently punished or divorced by their husbands and have their children taken away from them.
- There is an ancient history of Armenian and Assyrian Christians in Iran; these are protected by the state, but treated as second-class citizens. They are not allowed to let Christians from Muslim backgrounds attend their services, nor are they allowed to worship in Persian, the national language.
- It's no surprise that many Iranian believers feel forced to leave Iran and try to start a new life elsewhere.







