Keep walking...

We continue to explore the theme of discipleship in our Sunday services. The language often used in the bible for living our lives with God is that of walking. People of old walked everywhere and taking footsteps was very much the rhythm of life. To walk with God was to journey with him at every moment of the day – to share the whole of life with him.

The London Institute of Contemporary Christianity, LICC for short, champions the idea of whole life discipleship – all of us are full-time Christian workers. They even produce FTCW badges for people to wear to help remind them of their role in society and kingdom service. As we think more about discipleship, I would encourage you to think widely about life and service beyond church and to focus on this idea of walking with the Lord.

We must walk in the light knowing that God sees our every action and indeed reads our very thoughts! In Genesis 5:24, Enoch was commended for walking faithfully with God – we know little more about him but that is some commendation to be remembered by!

At a recent memorial/thanksgiving service, someone held up a bumper sticker that said: "Live your life so the vicar doesn't have to lie at your funeral."

Let's try and keep walking faithfully with God as we follow in the footsteps of Jesus. He sees what we are up to even when no one else is looking.

Prayer is also a key part of our discipleship, and we looked at this topic in the third of the series. Many of us enjoyed some special time together over our recent Sabbath of Prayer. I was a bit disappointed that many of the regular congregation did not participate in the times together at the church. These sessions were so special as we sought the Lord and found blessing and encouragement in his presence. Please do consider joining in for some of the next one in

Lead me in the right path, O Lord, or my enemies will conquer me. Make your way plain for me to follow NLT


Waiting for directions to get me safely through enemy lines. The Message

Swift Boxes Installed...

If you have heard strange tweeting sounds from on high, this is a speaker issuing bird calls to attract swifts over the coming weeks.

Brian's cousin Robin (pictured right) and his friend Bob Lord from Hampshire Swifts returned to the Island last month to install the first three nesting boxes in our bell chamber. These are fitted behind the wooden louvres above the clock. If these are successful, more may be added in 2025.

Bob comments: "Our Swift population nationwide is in trouble and declining. Swifts have adapted to living

amongst us in holes in buildings, but these are being blocked-up as we move from timber to UPVC fittings - and these don't shrink and crack, creating small nooks-and-crannies for wildlife. New artificial spaces are needed if we want to save our Swifts.



In Shanklin, there are a few swifts in the town during their breeding season (May to August) and now, the United Reformed Church, in partnership with Hampshire Swifts is helping to boost the number of

spaces available for them. A box containing three nest spaces has been fitted behind the louvres in the top floor of the tower. A call-player has been fitted, which acts as a lure to attract birds, so if you are in the vicinity of the church during the summer, keep your eyes peeled, look up

and listen. You may be lucky enough to see and hear Swifts taking up residence."

Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. James 1: 2 - 4

Many of you in our church family are aware of an incident that happened to me at work during late January, and because of the nature of it, I had to report it to management.

Management told me that was the correct decision. An informal investigation ensued with the colleague involved. I had to wait many weeks for the outcome and chose to take sick leave until it was resolved - fortunately I had a very understanding GP. Management at work totally understood.

During this time I confided in family, friends and close church friends who prayed and encouraged me to stand firm and remain strong in the Lord. Thank you to all those who supported me by praying and showing me love and compassion - we truly have a wonderful church family.

Everyone I spoke to were shocked by the situation I was in and many people saying it was persecution and a spiritual attack. It's not always easy being a Christian in a secular work environment but I held on to the truth despite the lies. I feel I've witnessed to management through my response to the outcome of the investigation, and it's resulted in some changes to how certain things function at work - so some good has come out of something bad.

The truth will always be revealed and we must always stick to our beliefs and convictions, no matter what opposition we face.

I've become closer to the Lord throughout this episode and all the glory goes to our God in the highest.

God chose a time of upheaval for Jesus to come into our world. The Greek empire had been overthrown by the Romans, but almost everybody still spoke Greek. Straight Roman roads made travelling much easier. This meant that the early Christians could carry God's Good News all over the Mediterranean world.

Today we can reach far further using modern communication methods. Local media advertised our Good Friday procession of Witness beforehand, with the photo in the County Press so large as to be unmissable.

When chatting to someone in Morrisons about the procession, the checkout operator chimed in, "Oh yes, I saw that in the paper." It

also appeared on Facebook. If you look below the photo (reproduced by kind permission of the Isle of Wight County Press), you can see that more than 200 people liked or loved this post, and 13 shared it to their own pages.

Christians Working Together in The Bay will will take it in turns to carry a cross through Shanklin, calling at St Blasius, St Saviour's, United Reformed, Methodist, Sacred Heart and St Paul's churches. At each stop, part of the crucifixion story will be read. At 6.30am, on Easter Sunday, there will be a gathering at Hope Road, Shanklin, for a service at sunrise.

But many of those 67 comments were mocking. One wrote 'Next week can we have a re-enactment of Frodo's journey to Mordor'. How ironic that those who post deliberately offensive or provocative messages online are called trolls.

How do you answer the person who wrote: 'there is not one single thread of credible evidence that it did happen.'? You don't. Someone who wilfully chooses to be that ignorant is just what Jesus warned about when he said, 'Don't throw your pearls to pigs. If you do, they may trample them under their feet, and turn and tear you to

pieces.' (Matthew 7:6)

We should neither be surprised nor discouraged by such reactions. Instead, we continue to sow the seed, knowing that God is the Lord of the harvest. Let us be encouraged by the feedback of those whose good opinion is worth having. For example:

- "I have been coming to CatURpillars since it opened, and I have always found it to be the most welcoming atmosphere. It's the best. Thank you"
- A family came, for the first time, to Messy Church in March. They arrived early the following morning. Mum said that they were supposed to be going to a party but the children had asked to come to church instead.
- From the support manager of the Mother and Baby unit: "I am astounded by the level of support and kindness you have all shown. A massive thank you, we are eternally grateful"
- "I don't really go to church, but I know there's always a warm welcome here."
- Dover Park School had an Ofsted Inspection in March. On the second day, the Open the Book team arrived at the same time as the Inspector. She chatted with them, saying she had put an approving sentence about OtB in her report because the children had told her they love it.
- And this is what God says about us: "you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light"

Isn't it wonderful to hear such positive comments. Please don't be offended by this comparison with our canine friends, but think for a moment how it makes you feel when a dog comes towards you wagging its tail. By contrast, internet trolls cause hurt and dread. What can we do to draw people in?

Acts 4:36 records that the apostles gave a Levite, Joseph, the nickname 'Barnabas' which means 'son of encouragement'. He was the first to befriend the converted persecutor, Saul, and gave unreliable Mark a second chance.

Thank you, Lord, that You are using so many different ways to reach

so many people. Please help me to be a Barnabas.

The View From The Cross ~ 1

In Matthew 16, Jesus tells His followers "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it." (vv 24 & 25)

With Easter behind us we now look to Ascension Day and Pentecost ... Let's take a look at what it means for us as we seek to walk the way of Jesus today.

We'll look at the *View from the Cross* and *Denying Ourselves* and then next time at *Picking up the Cross Daily* and *Following Him.* Here is what Neil Anderson has to say about these:

The View From The Cross

"For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it. What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?" (Matthew 16:25-26)

Three guidelines from these verses summarize the view from the cross, which we must adopt to counteract the self-centred worldview promoted by the god of this world.

First, we must sacrifice the lower life to gain the higher life. If you want to save your natural life (i.e. find your identity and sense of self-worth in positions, titles, accomplishments and possessions and seek only worldly well-being), you will lose it. At best you can only possess these temporal values for a lifetime, only to lose everything for eternity.

Furthermore, in all your efforts to possess these earthly treasures, you will fail to gain all that can be yours in Christ. Shoot for this world

and that's all you'll get, and eventually, you will lose even that. But shoot for the next world and God will throw in the benefits of knowing Him in this present life as well. Paul put it this way:

"Have nothing to do with godless myths and old wives' tales; rather, train yourself to be godly. For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come" (1 Timothy 4: 7-8)

Second, sacrifice the pleasure of things to gain the pleasure of life. What would you accept in trade for the fruit of the Spirit in your life? What material possession, what amount of money, what position or title would you exchange for the love, joy, peace and patience that you enjoy in Christ? Surely nothing! Victory over self comes as we learn to love people and use things instead of using people and loving things.

Third, sacrifice the temporal to gain the eternal. Possibly the greatest sign of spiritual maturity is the ability to postpone rewards. It is far better to know that we are the children of God than to gain anything that the world calls valuable. Even if following Christ results in hardships in this life, He will make it right in eternity.

Heavenly Father, You alone are God. Help me to choose the higher life today instead of seeking the pleasures of this world.

Denying Self

"Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves" (Matthew 16:24)

A primary reason why we struggle to fulfil Christ's Great Commission is that we are guilty of a great omission. We fail to deny ourselves.

Denying yourself is not the same as self-denial. Students, athletes and cult members practice self-denial, restricting themselves from substances and activities that keep them from reaching their goals. But the ultimate purpose of self-denial is self-glorification. The ultimate purpose of denying self is to glorify God.

Jesus was talking about denying yourself in the essential battle of life. The scramble for the throne, the struggle over who is going to be

God. Jesus doesn't enter into that battle - He's already won it. He occupies the throne and graciously offers to share it with us. But we want to be king in our lives by ourselves. Until we deny ourselves that which was never meant to be ours - the role of being God in our lives - we will never be at peace with God, or ourselves and we will never be free.

You were not designed to function independently of God, nor was your soul designed to function as master. You will either serve God and His kingdom or Satan and his kingdom. Self-seeking, selfserving, self-justifying, self-glorifying, self-centred and self-confident living is in actuality living and serving the world, the flesh and the devil. On the other hand, denying yourself is not self-mortification. God is not trying to annihilate you; He is trying to restore you.

When you deny yourself, you invite God to take the throne of your life, to occupy what is rightfully His, so that you may function as a person who is spiritually alive in Christ. Denying yourself is essential to spiritual freedom.

Lord, too many times I have tried to live independently of You. I deny myself today and yield the throne of my life to You.

Praise God for rescue of another Chibok girl

Another Chibok schoolgirl has been rescued! Lydia Simon was rescued by the Nigerian Army, in an answer to the fervent prayers of Christians in Nigeria and around the world.

Lydia, who was among the missing Chibok Secondary schoolgirls, was rescued along with her three children by troops conducting Operation Desert Sanity III, around Ngoshe in the Gwoza Local Government Area of Borno State.


The army did not share further details of the rescue, but it is a wonderful answer to prayer for the Chibok parents who gathered last weekend to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the abduction by Islamic militants Boko Haram. On 14th April 2014, more than 270 schoolgirls – mostly Christian – were kidnapped from their dormitories at the federal government school in Chibok. Around 90 are still missing.

The news of Lydia Simon's release is reason for thanksgiving. Please continue to pray alongside the Chibok parents and community for the release of all the young women.

In June this year we have been asked by the police to have patrols outside the Isle of Wight Festival site on the Friday, Saturday and Sunday of the Festival where 90,000 people are expected to descend on Seaclose Park (Newport) for the weekend.

We will be covering the route from Church on the Roundabout (Coppins Bridge) to the main entrance of the Isle of Wight Festival at Medina College. This may extend to the Isle of Wight Festival bus station depending on what is needed on the patrols.

In addition, great news, we have for the first time in the history of the IoW Festival, also been allowed to patrol inside the festival site as well, Bejoy Pal (CEO of Ascension Trust, our Governing Body) is joining us for the festival patrols.

Therefore, we are expecting to be giving out a lot of these particular items to festival goers and need your help, you can give any of the items needed or alternatively donate any money towards this outreach.

To help support the Isle of Wight Street Pastors a national call has gone out to mainland initiatives for street pastor volunteers to come help us which has had a great response so far- prayer needed. Due to mainland Street Pastors coming over, we are also looking for accommodation. If you have a spare bedroom and are able to accommodate a Street Pastor, please let us know. I am happy to collect any donations from your congregation or any money can be donated by the following means: -<u>https://iowstreetpastors.org.uk/get-involved/donate-online/</u>.

Whilst on patrol, Street Pastors will talk to people they meet, giving out Lollipops and chocolates to show God's love in action or to act as an icebreaker to start a conversation. They may also use lollipops in reaction to a volatile or difficult situation where someone is in need of help or distraction.

We may respond to someone:

- Suffering the effects of having a lot to drink or taking other substances
- Being separated from their friends, or need help to get home,
- Or when there is some argument or altercation brewing

Street Pastors cannot interrupt an ongoing fight - although they can call the police - but they can certainly avoid one starting.

As they patrol, Street Pastors pick up glass bottles and broken glass that might otherwise cause an injury or be used as a weapon. They give out flip flops to women who have found their high heels are no longer bearable after being on them for a while. Street Pastors also give out foil blankets to people who may be cold from not wearing the right clothing for the weather, saving them from Hypothermia.

Most patrols also involve helping people home, whether that's directing them to a bus station, taxis or ringing a friend or family member to pick them up

Basically Street Pastors are simply there to care, listen and help in the name of Jesus.

This is a fantastic opportunity to show potentially thousands of people the love of Jesus.

10 things Christians should know about India's 2024 elections

Please pray for India's Christians during the nation's elections.

Voting began on 19th April in India's nationwide elections. The elections continue in seven stages until 1st June, with the results planned to be revealed on 4th June.

Christians in India know that these elections could have a significant impact on religious freedom, both in individual states and in the country as a whole. Christians and other religious minorities are facing increasing pressure, largely thanks to a rise of Hindu nationalism. Hindu extremists say that all Indians should be Hindu, and openly call for the erasure of other religions in the country. The results of the elections could have an impact on the amount of power and influence that Hindutva ideology wields in India.

Here are 10 things you need to know about the Indian election, how it will affect Christians, and how you can pray.

1. 12.5% of the world can vote

The electorate in India is enormous. The 2024 elections are set to be the largest democratic election in human history, with 960 million eligible voters – which is 12.5% of the global population of eight billion. The last time India had a national election, in 2019, nearly 615 million of the eligible voters did cast a ballot.

2. India has a parliamentary system

India's government is similar to the United Kingdom's, in that the elections decide who will sit in the lower house of parliament, called the Lok Sabha or House of the People in India. There are 543 seats, and a prime minister is elected from among the people who win those seats. The current prime minister is Narendra Modi of the BJP

party, and he is standing again.

3. The election takes a long time

Because so many people vote and India is such a huge country, the election itself will take nearly six weeks, lasting from 19 April to 1 June. Additionally, India's election laws are designed to make voting as feasible as possible no matter where a person lives – the Election Commission of India is required to ensure that a voting station is available within 2 km (1.2 miles) of every voter. That means even if someone lives in a remote village in the Himalayas, election workers will carry a voting machine to a nearby location.

4. The main parties are the BJP and the INC

The ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the India National Congress (INC) parties (and their coalition partners) are the primary two parties that people will decide between. The BJP has had two straight elections of significant success, which means Narendra Modi has been prime minister since 2014. Broadly speaking, the INC is a centrist/centre-left political party, and the BJP is a right-wing party with roots in Hindu nationalism.

5. The elections will have significant consequences for Christians

Because the ruling party in India has significant ties to Hindutva, the ideology that says Indian identity is tied to Hinduism, another victory in this year's election could be continued difficulties for India's religious minorities, including Christians. "These [elections] are very crucial, as this will decide the next five years," says Priya Sharma*, an Open Doors partner in India. "If the current government stays in power, there are chances that India will undergo a complete transformation into a Hindu nationalist state. India will be absolutely intolerant to Christians and other religious minorities."

6. The elections could continue a dangerous trend

Since 2014, India has gone from 28 on the World Watch List to 11 on the most current list. That shows how the Christian minority in India has increasingly been facing persecution, discrimination and opposition. "In the past ten years, Hindu extremists have openly threatened to eliminate Christianity and other minority religions in India," Sharma says. "There have been open statements of hatred

and threats against Christians. Pastors, leaders and lay Christians have been killed and attacked brutally in broad daylight and the accused are allowed to go free, without any punishment."

7. Christians are targeted by anti-conversion laws

Anti-conversion laws are currently in place in 12 of India's 28 states, and purport to prevent forced or coerced conversion from one religion to another (with the exception of conversion to Hinduism). In reality, these laws have created an environment where conversion to a minority religion is very dangerous, and sharing the gospel can lead to persecution. "Under Indian law, citizens are free to choose their religion – but Hindu extremist groups misuse the laws," says Sharma. "They falsely accuse pastors of offering incentives to people to convert to Christianity or say that church leaders force innocent people to become followers of Jesus. These extremists lodge false complaints at the police station, getting pastors arrested, enmeshed in legal battles and even sent to prison."

8. There are fears of a national anti-conversion law

Indian Christians are concerned that a win by the ruling party could lead to a national anti-conversion law, rather than simply state-level legislation. "Anti-conversion laws already existed in seven states before the BJP came into power in the national government in 2014, but since they formed their government, anti-conversion laws or bills have been imposed in five more states," Sharma says. "There have even been several attempts to pass a national anti-conversion law. If the BJP wins the 2024 elections, there is a high chance of an anticonversion law being introduced at the national level."

9. A national anti-conversion law could have devastating consequences

These laws are often used to attack converts from Hinduism, and any pastors who are seen as evangelising to Hindus. In 2023, Open Doors partners report that more than 2,300 pastors, leaders and believers were falsely accused, arrested and/or detained for forceful conversion. If a national law passes, this could make things even more dangerous. "If the anti-conversion law is introduced at the national level, this will create huge turbulence for the Christian community," Sharma says. "More Christians could be tortured, attacked, killed and forcefully 'reconverted' to Hinduism."

10. Christians are not in despair – but are asking God for help

Sharma says that the church in India is growing, despite the persecution. And she's encouraged by growing unity among believers. "Most Christians only want to vote for a good government," Sharma says. "Believers are arranging prayer chains, fasting and hosting prayer meetings for a moral, ethical and righteous government to come to power." Despite the dangers and the persecution, Indian Christians know God is faithful and good. Please join them in praying during this crucial period.

Please Pray

- For fair and safe elections, and that religious minorities would be protected during the campaigning and voting period
- That anti-conversion laws would not spread further, endangering converts and those sharing the gospel
- That whoever wins the election would uphold India's constitutional right to religious freedom .

How many Christians are there in India?

There are a large number of Christians in India – more than 71 million – but it's still only five per cent of the country's Hindu-majority population.

How are Christians persecuted in India?

India is the largest democracy in the world – but Christians in many parts of the nation find themselves increasingly under threat.

In 2023, persecution against Christians in India hit the headlines. In early January, riots against believers broke out in Chhattisgarh, where gangs of armed Hindu extremists went door to door and assaulted believers. In May, ethnoreligious clashes in Manipur have shaken the region and the country, disproportionately impacting Christians; the violence left 400 churches in ashes and 50,000 believers displaced.
